

## FALL 2020 SPECIAL GOLD AWARDS

Submit your FAFSA and UNCG application by Dec. 1 and receive priority consideration for special scholarships reserved for our Fall 2020 applicants.

These scholarships, called Gold Awards, are valued at \$4,000 per year and are renewable for up to four years. That's a \$16,000 value.

Gold Awards will be granted based on factors including GPA, test scores, and demonstrated financial need.

An essay is not required for Gold Award consideration, but you are required to submit your complete application and FAFSA information by UNCG's Dec. 1 priority deadline!

#### SUBMITYOUR APPLICATION & FAFSA BY DEC. 1

Automatic scholarship consideration and maximum financial aid eligibility depend on meeting UNCG's Dec. 1 priority deadline for admission applications and the priority filing date for FAFSA. There is no separate application for UNCG merit scholarships!

#### Admission

- A complete application package includes:
- \$65 application fee
- Official high school transcripts
- Official transcripts and/or test scores, if applicable, for any college credit earned during high school
- Official scores for the SAT (code: 5913) and/or ACT (code: 3166) • Essay (required for scholarship consideration)

#### **Financial Aid**

- FAFSAs (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) submitted by Dec. 1 receive priority status from UNCG and, while there are no guarantees, are in the best position to receive certain funds awarded on a first-come, first serve basis.
- FAFSA information determines eligibility for need-based aid, and students are required to submit the FAFSA annually (beginning Oct. 1 for the upcoming year) to receive federal grants, loans, and work-study opportunities, as well as need-based awards from UNCG.

# **BLUE & GOLD SCHOLARSHIPS**

"Blue & Gold Scholarships" is the collective name for more than 30 named, merit-based scholarships awarded annually by the UNCG Office of Undergraduate Admissions based on qualities including academic performance and extracurricular pursuits. Approximately 60 students receive these scholarships, which are renewable for four years and range in value from \$2,000 to the full cost of tuition, fees, room, and board (including out-of-state costs).

#### **A SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY**

There is no separate application process for UNCG merit scholarships! Consideration for these awards is automatic for first-year students seeking fall admission who submit a complete application, including essay, by UNCG's Dec. 1 priority deadline.

## **PREMIER BLUE & GOLD SCHOLARSHIPS**

#### **Ethel Virginia Butler Centennial Scholarship**

A North Carolina native and alumna of the Woman's College (as UNCG was then known), Ethel Virginia Butler taught high school before joining the staff of the university bookstore in 1945, where she retired as manager after 29 years of service.

Typical annual award value: From \$5,000 to full tuition, fees, room, and **board** (including out-of-state costs)

Criteria: Unrestricted

#### Kathleen Price and Joseph M. Bryan Scholarship

The late Joseph McKinley Bryan Sr., who established this scholarship in 1984 with his wife, Kathleen Price, was an altruist focused on community and is the namesake of UNCG's Bryan School of Business & Economics.

#### Typical annual award value: \$6,000-\$10,000

In addition, the opportunity for a paid internship and stipend for study abroad

**Criteria:** Major within Bryan School of Business & Economics

#### **Class of 1955 Merit Scholarship**

Members of the class of 1955, when UNCG was the all-female Woman's College, presented this scholarship at their 50th reunion as thanks to UNCG for contributing so significantly to their lives and so that others might experience the same opportunities.

#### Typical annual award value: \$8,000

In addition, internship support of \$1,250 and \$2,500 toward study abroad

Criteria: Unrestricted



Blue & Gold Scholarship consideration is automatic for incoming first-year students who submit a complete application, including essay, by UNCG's Dec. 1 priority deadline.

### **Consideration requirements**

- Eligibility for the Lloyd International Honors College (minimum 1270 SAT or minimum 26 ACT or 3.8 weighted GPA)
- Submit complete UNCG application (including essay) and supplemental Honors College application by Dec. 1

# THE HONORS COLLEGE **REYNOLDS SCHOLARSHIP**

The university's most generous and prestigious undergraduate award, the Katharine Smith Reynolds Scholarship is awarded by the Lloyd International Honors College to ten incoming freshmen who have distinguished themselves as all-around extraordinary student-leaders motivated to achieve. More than 500 recipients have graduated since the award was established in 1962 to honor Reynolds, an alumna.

**Typical annual award value:** \$8,000 per year for four years

#### Additional stipends:

- \$2,500 for study abroad
- \$1,250 for community involvement
- \$1,250 for internship participation

• Students who are N.C. residents and seeking fall semester freshman admission

#### Award notification timeline

**Nominees:** Phone interviews begin late January Finalists: Campus interviews held late February through early March **Recipients:** Notification by March 15
